In Term 1, we had the pleasure of welcoming Dr. Kun Yu from the University of Technology Sydney, who has been instrumental in the early stages of our new research project: 'Understanding Student Emotion and Task Behaviour During Mathematics Assessments'.

This study aims to uncover new insights into how students experience and react to assessment tasks. The findings are expected to help us pinpoint specific aspects of assessments that may cause difficulties, thereby allowing us to mitigate stress and anxiety associated with our termly Milestone tasks.

Furthermore, the insights gained from this research could lead to broader positive changes in the support structures available to students who find assessments particularly challenging.

In collaboration with the UTS team, the necessary documentation was drafted that will be required for the study to commence, pending ethics approval.














## Ultimate FRISBEE

While this season has come to an end, there is more frisbee on the horizon this year - we welcome all who would like to join our winter league! Just come and see Benny to have a chat!






















## Bathurst SHOW
